August Österle is Associate Professor of Social Policy, Deputy Director of the Institute for Social Policy at WU Wien (Vienna University of Economics and Business) and Honorary Professor at Corvinus University Budapest. Previously he was Visiting Professor of International Comparative Studies at the University of Bremen and the Hanse Institute for Higher Studies and has held visiting positions at Sciences Po Grenoble, the European University Institute Florence and Universities in Bratislava, Budapest, London and Bath. Since 2016, he is Associate Editor of the International Journal of Social Welfare. The main areas of research and teaching are: comparative

welfare state research and the socio-economics of health and long-term care policies; cross-border and transnational issues in social policy; access to social rights; equity and social policy.

The main areas of research and teaching are social policy, social security, old age policies, long-term care and comparative social policies.
