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August Österle is Professor of Social Policy and Deputy Director of the Institute for Social Policy at WU Wien (Vienna University of Economics and Business; www.wu.ac.at) and Co-Head of the Research Institute for Economics of Aging at this University. In addition, August Österle is Honorary Professor at Corvinus University Budapest (www.uni-corvinus.hu). Previously he was Visiting Professor of International Comparative Studies at the University of Bremen and the Hanse Institute for Higher Studies and has held visiting positions at Sciences Po Grenoble, the European University Institute Florence and universities in Bratislava, Budapest, London and Bath.

His research focuses on the socioeconomics of social policy, most importantly in the fields of health and long-term care. Major current research activities include transnational social policy, cross-border activities in health and long-term care (including projects on migrant care work and on medical travel) and work on access to and equity in health and long-term care (including a project on long-term care policy developments in China). Since 2016, August Österle is Associate Editor of the International Journal of Social Welfare. In addition, he is reviewer for international scientific journals in health economics and in health and social policy research and a reviewer for several social science foundations in Central Europe. Also, he has served as a member of several project advisory and conference organizing boards.

He is teaching social policy and health economics on undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate levels and has received several awards for innovation and excellence in teaching, including the Austrian National Award for Excellence in Teaching in 2016.
